



COURSE DESCRIPTION

Our goal as leaders is to bring the values of scouting home to the youth. Working the patrol method with members of your patrol will help you gain the vision, experience, and challenge you need to reach a higher level of leadership while learning how to bring it home to the youth.

Wood Badge is a primer leadership training that is an accumulation of the training continuum. Wood Badge is for all the Boy Scout programs: Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Varsity Scouting, and Venturing. It is also for all District and Council leaders.

Wood Badge is scouting at its best but it is useful in the workplace and the home. The focus is leadership NOT outdoor skills.

OBJECTIVES OF WOOD BADGE

The Wood Badge experience is divided into two parts – a practical phase and an application phase.

PRACTICAL PHASE

The practical phase consists of one week of instruction. During this time you will become a member of a patrol, share your skills and knowledge, become an effective

team and have a great experience while doing it.

APPLICATION PHASE

“working your ticket”

You will have 18 months to complete your ticket while becoming proficient in the leadership and team-building skills you have learned at Wood Badge.

WHO MAY ATTEND

Any currently registered adult volunteer or employee of the BSA, regardless of the program area(s) they are involved in.

HOW TO QUALIFY

- Must be a registered as an adult leader in BSA.
- Have completed the leader specific for your scouting position.
- Have a current Boy Scout Physical
